Balance sheet account changes are the basic building blocks for preparing a statement of cash flows. These changes in assets, liabilities, and owners' equity accounts are the amounts reported in the statement of cash flows, or the changes are used to determine the cash flow amounts (as in the case of the change in retained earnings, which is separated into its net income component and its dividends component).

Forecasting the balance sheet. At this stage, it's possible to complete the balance sheet in our 3 statement model, except for the cash balance Cash Equivalents Cash and cash equivalents are the most liquid of all assets on the balance sheet. Cash equivalents include money market securities, banker's acceptances, which will be the last step. Working capital items are forecasted based on assumptions around average days payable and receivable, as well as inventory turns.

*Does the Ending Balance of a Cash-Flow Statement Always ...*

Typically a simple cash flow statement for a business is along the following lines. What this cash flow statement tells us is that the ending cash balance is equal to the beginning cash balance plus cash receipts less cash payments. If we rearrange this we have: Receipts – Payments = Cash flow = Ending cash balance – Beginning cash balance
