Common Content Area Roots and Affixes - ReadWriteThink

First, prefixes and suffixes, most of which are derived from ancient Greek or classical Latin, have a droppable -o-. As a general rule, this -o- almost always acts as a joint-stem to connect two consonantal roots (e.g. arthr- + -o- + -logy = arthrology), but generally, the -o- is dropped when connecting to a vowel-stem (e.g. arthr- + -itis = arthritis, instead of arthr-o-itis).

Prefixes are the parts that come at the front of a word, suffixes are the parts that come at the end of a word, and roots are the parts that lie in the middle of a word. Think of roots as the base of the word and prefixes and suffixes as word parts that are attached to the base. These basic word parts generally have the same meaning in whatever word they’re used.

Prefixes and suffixes are very important in English. They are sets of letters that are often placed at the beginning of a word(a prefix) or at the end of a word(a suffix) to change its meaning.

Generally, Latin prefixes go with Latin suffixes, while Greek prefixes go with Greek suffixes. Prefixes generally end in vowels or vowel sounds as in the bradycardia example above. Root words end in vowels. An example is the vowel "o" in the term "gastroenteritis". The parts are: gastro(root) - enteritis(suffix).
