Unfortunately, if you ' ve ever dreamed of owning a Kahn home yourself, the Esherick House (see lead photo) just went off the market this past February after being listed for several years. The listing underwent several price drops, most likely due to the fact that the house contains just one bedroom. Located in Philadelphia ' s Chestnut Hill neighborhood and built between 1959 and 1962 for bookseller Margaret Esherick, what the house lacks in size, it makes up for in character.
